Information Collected and How it is Used

During your visit to mec.ms.gov, we automatically collect and store the following information about your visit:

- 1. The Internet Protocol Address and domain name used but not the email address. The Internet Protocol address is a numerical identifier assigned either to your Internet service provider or directly to your computer. The Internet Protocol Address is used to direct Internet traffic to you.
- 2. The type of browser and operating system you used
- 3. The date and time you visited this site
- 4. The web pages or services you accessed at this site
- 5. The web site you visited prior to coming to this web site
- 6. If you send an email, the email address and contents of the email
- 7. If you participate in a survey, information volunteered in response to the survey
- 8. Electronic payment information If you give us credit card and/or bank account information to pay for a fee-based service, it will be used one time only to fulfill one order and we will not store credit card and/or bank account information.

The information we automatically collect or store is used to improve the content of our web services, to help us understand how people are using our services, and to monitor transactions made in the system. The information collected is not limited to text characters and may include audio, video, and graphic information formats you send us.

We use your email address to respond appropriately. This may be to respond to you, to address issues you identify, to further improve our web site, or to forward the email to another agency for appropriate action.

Public Disclosure
